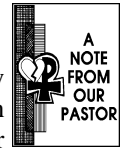

Dear Friends,



Once again the Bishop is 'forcing' me to take my vacation and in obedience to him, I will go to San Antonio this afternoon, to rest at my sister Catherine's house, before taking the trans-Atlantic flight tomorrow evening. I will land at the airport in Dublin, Ireland on Tuesday morning and one of the family will be there to take me on the 70 mile journey to the little Irish Cottage in Camolin, Co. Wexford, where I will spend my vacation.

Looking out the front windows, I will be able to see the distant hills, with the cows, sheep and horses grazing and in some fields the farmer cutting the corn, barley and oats. I will see the railway train, traveling from Dublin to the port at Rosslare, several times a day and hear the traffic on the N11 Highway, which is the main Road along the Eastern coast of Ireland. From the living room at the back of the cottage there is a beautiful view of Mount Leinster and the Church and the village of Camolin, which is only one mile from the house.

The weather in June is usually sunny and about 70 degrees and we don't need air conditioning in the homes as it gets down in the 50's at night! After a few days rest and when I recover from the jet-lag, I will be ready to visit relatives and friends, enjoy the Irish cooking and do some sight-seeing in the sunny-south-east of Ireland. My sister Catherine will arrive for her vacation on July 1<sup>st</sup> and we have planned a family reunion and a Mass of Thanksgiving for Saturday, July 3. The Mass will take place at St. Patrick Church in Monageer where I was baptized, made my First Communion, received the Sacrament of Confirmation and said my first Mass. Then we will go to a local hotel for the meal, the family get-together and the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Ordination Celebration.

My classmate and friend, Bishop Denis Brennan will be the homilist at the Mass of Thanksgiving and I must get a copy of his remarks to publish in future bulletins so you are more informed about my years in the seminary and as a priest from the Diocese of Ferns. I hope he will say that the Diocese of Ferns' loss was Corpus Christi's gain and that he enjoyed his visits to San Martin DePorres in Laredo and to St. Peter, Prince of the Apostles parish in Corpus Christi. He was visiting us in April of 2007 when the news broke that the Holy Father had appointed me as a Monsignor and he was excited that I was receiving that great honor from the Pope Benedict XVI.

Again, I want to sincerely thank the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee and all who made the Mass and the meal and gathering in the Hall such a wonderful event back on May 29<sup>th</sup>. I deeply appreciate the hard word that was put into organizing the Mass and the meal and I will treasure, watch and read the video and the book of pictures and letters for as long as I live. Thank you for your prayers, support, affirmation and the gifts you gave me for my Anniversary. Have I told you lately that I love you! I do and may God Bless you now and always.
