**YOUNG ADULTS AND FINANCIAL INDEPENDENCE**

Adult children may be more dependent than every on their parents, according to Charles Schwab's Families and Money survey. The survey revealed that 41% of parents still provide some level of support to their children ages 23-28, whereas a whopping 86% of Sandwich Generation parents report they were fully independent by age 25. Why the swing? College debt, unemployment and poor consumer spending habits are cited as the primary causes of this longer term dependency.

One of your goals as a parent should be to teach your children, by word and example, what it means to manage money in accord with God's principles. Deuteronomy 6:6-7 says, "And these words which I command you this day shall be upon your heart; and you shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise."

Of course, just because you provide good example and solid teaching to your children doesn't mean they will follow your counsel. After all, they do have free will. But good example and teaching increase the likelihood of a positive outcome exponentially. Proverbs 22:6 alludes to this when it says, "Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old, he will not depart from it."

Teaching your children to become effective stewards of Providence will not only help them achieve financial independence, but very more important, live out their independence in ways that honor the Lord. God love you.

**THE SAINT OF THE WEEK IS ST. MARIA GORETTI 1890-1902.** She was born at Clorinaldo, near Ancona, Italy, on October 16, she was the daughter of a farmworker who moved the family to Ferriere di Conca, near Anzio. She was stabbed to death on July 6 by Alexander Serenelli who lived in the same house as the Goretti's, because she resisted his attempts to seduce her. She said she would rather die than commit a mortal sin. She was canonized for her purity in 1950 by Pope Pius XII in the presence of her murderer, who completely reformed his life after he had a vision of Maria. The Mass for the feast of St. Maria Goretti is on Tuesday at 8 a.m. Do try to bring the family for this special feast.
